Quick Facts

- **Started in 2005 – 21st Annual this year (paused in 2020) and initiated by a core group of volunteers.**
- **Prior to the 2005 Parade, the last parade in the Township was for the Anderson Bicentennial in 1993.**
- **Over 1,000 persons participate in the parade – about 75 groups.**
- **Approximately 8,000 to 10,000 persons watch the parade each year.**
- **Over 20 sponsors also provide funding and in kind services to make it happen.**
- **Begins at 10am and ends around 11:15am – volunteer needs from 8am-Noon, or any part thereof!**





Anderson Independence Day Parade When & Where

- **Saturday, July 4th**
- **Parade Begins at 10am; however, we need volunteers before, during and after**
- **Parade begins at Beechmont Avenue Fire Station and ends at Anderson Towne Center**
- **Most volunteers will report to Beechmont Fire Station @ 8am, later volunteers can arrive around 9:30-10am**
- **Need youth & adults!**
- **Will again have a 1 Mile Race before the event, from Christ Hospital Outpatient area, which would begin around 9:35am**





Anderson Independence Day Parade Volunteer Duties

- **Registration Area – Greeting & instructions**
- **Parade Staging – Setting up & placement**
- **Parade Route Assistance – Walking with groups and helping keep everyone safe**
- **Shuttle Bus & Median – Assisting participants getting on shuttle bus to front and directing groups at median by Kroger**
- **Hospitality / Guest Relations / Photographer – Greeting and helping participants, spectators, etc.**
- **1 Mile Race – Assisting participants and their families before the parade (when the roadway is closed)**
