How did we start?

- 1941: One career firefighter and several volunteers
- One station
- Dedicated people made and still make a difference



How do we provide services today?

69 career firefighter personnel, of which 60 are paramedics

6 Engines (min 3 staffed)

1 Quint (staffed every day)

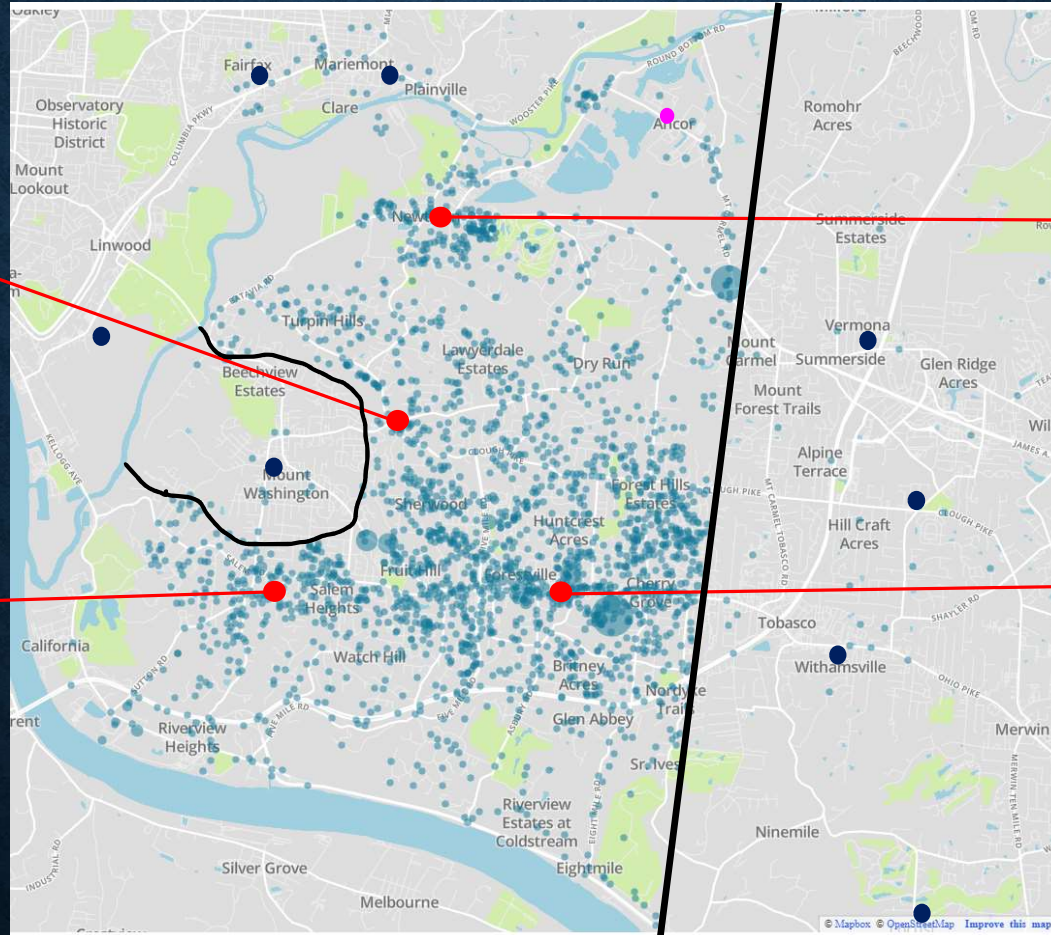

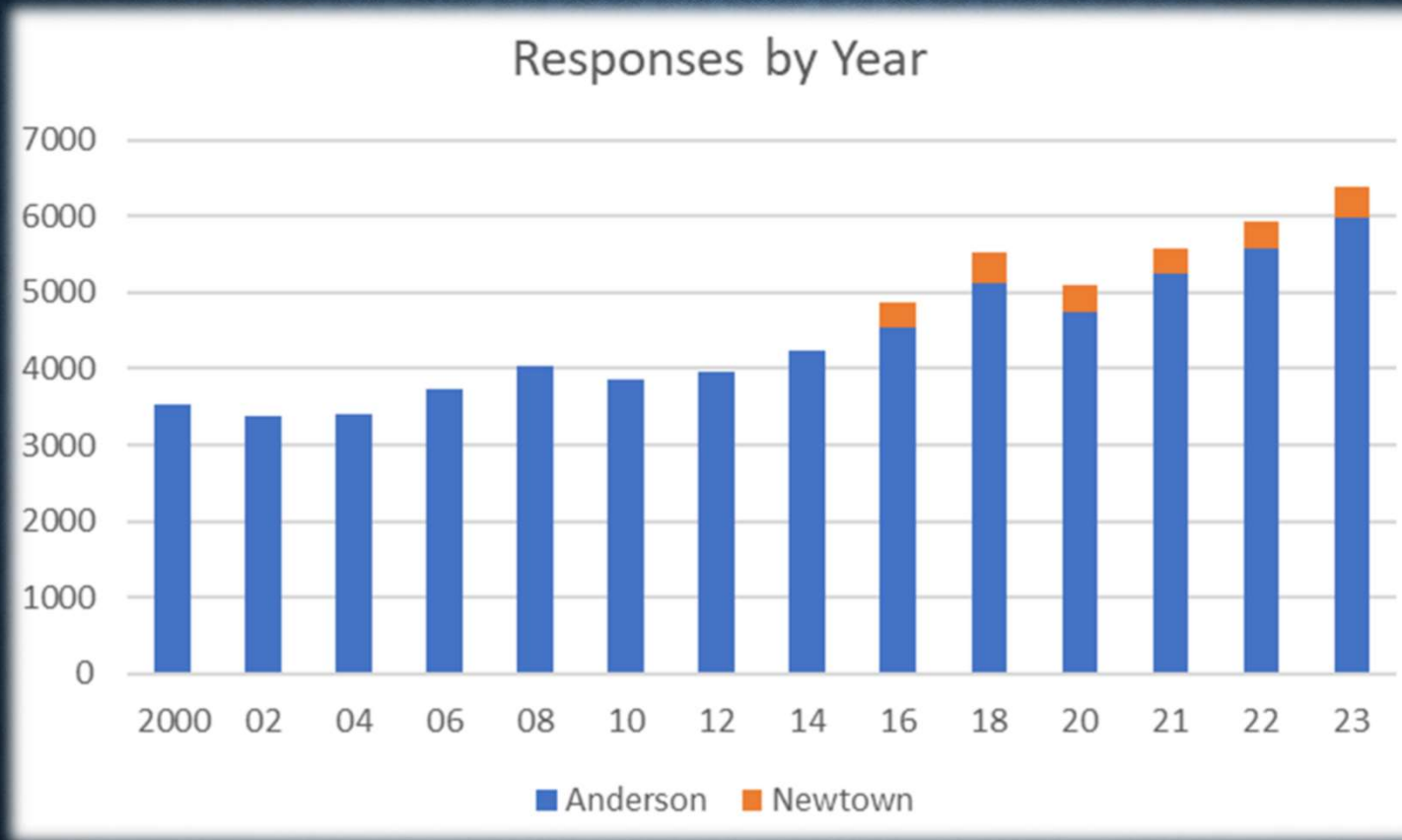

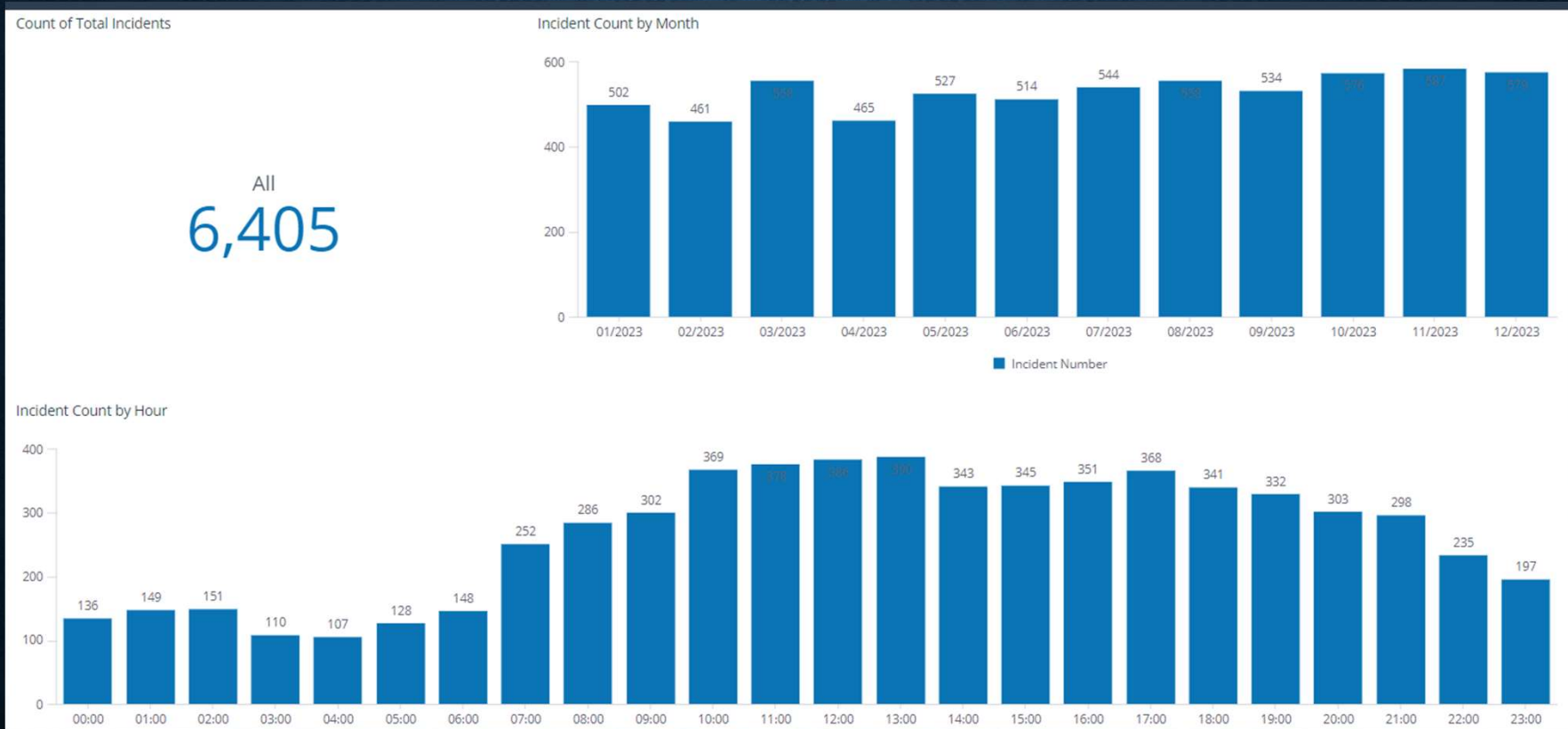

When do we respond?

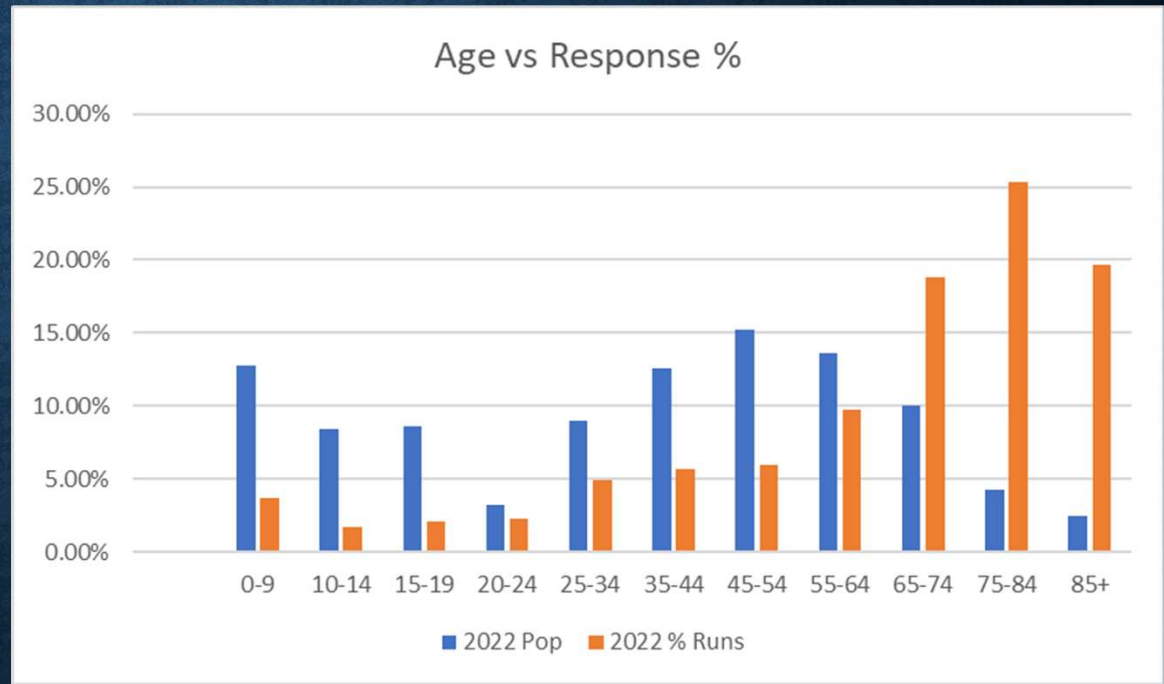


All 2023 Runs by Month & Hour of Day

Anderson Township Fire & Rescue

A serious EMS call receives 3-4 paramedic/firefighters and possibly 1 additional EMT -

- 2 on an engine/quint
- 2 on the medic unit

Why?

- **Better patient care**
 - Each medic/EMT has designated function on the team
 - Increases overall efficiency
- Reduces personnel injuries (carrying equipment, lifting patients etc.)

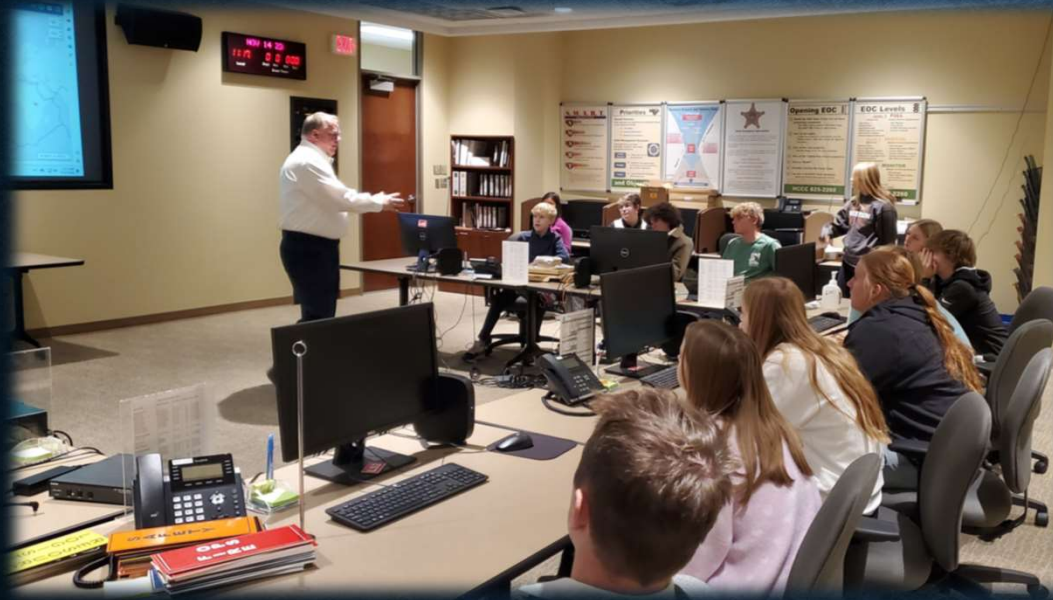
